Free Level 2 Bikeability Cycle Training at Walker Activity Dome.

In February half term the city is offering level 2 Bikeability training for those children who can already ride a bike with confidence and are ready to move on to more complex training on the roads.

The training sessions will be available to children who live and study in Newcastle upon Tyne local authority area and it is free of charge to participants.

The training is delivered by experienced qualified national standard instructors who have DBS checks and work for Newcastle City Councils Road Safety Team.

The dates of the training are:

- Monday 17th February (10am-12pm -Lunch time - 1pm-3pm)
- Tuesday 18th February (10am-12pm -Lunch time - 1pm-3pm)
- All training is delivered from Walker Activity Dome, Wharrier Street, Newcastle upon Tyne, NE6 3BR.

They have their own fleet of bikes and helmets available to use free of charge at Walker Activity Dome. Parking, changing facilities, toilets and vending machines are also available at the Centre.
