KING JESUS CHILDREN'S HOME

In assembly on Monday I spoke to the children about our International Link School and orphanage in Kumasi in Ghana.



The children saw photographs and watched videos of the children playing and working. They tried to guess one of the games and came up with some good ideas. Please talk to your child about the assembly and see what they have remembered.

The orphanage has to pay for each child to attend school (£90) per term and provide the children with a uniform, books and school shoes and this is where the problem lies. If the children don't go to school in white socks (some of which we have already sent) and school shoes they are sent home. This is a half hour walk for the child. Many of the shoes they have are too small or too large. We are asking you to send in your child's school shoes and *football* boots once they have grown out of them and are still in good condition. We don't need wellies or boots. Let's help these children as much as we can by sending them something which is of no use to us.
