#### **Applying for Nursery Places**

Did you know that on average, in the UK, no age group is currently consuming the recommended amount of dietary fibre? The recommended amounts for our children are 15g per day for 2-5 year olds and 20g per day for children aged 5 to 11 years. Fibre is found in a range of foods, including fruit, vegetables, pulses (beans, lentils and peas), nuts and seeds, starchy food (such as potatoes), oats and grains. You could try to build in some simple swaps such as having wholegrain pasta, bread and cereals instead of white. For fussier children, this change could be attempted gradually for example, by swapping only a small amount of whole grain pasta at first.


#### KS1 – Wonder Women
