Dear Parents

As half term approaches, I know that you will have concerns about the government's plans to reopen schools from June 1st and what this might mean for our children, staff and school.

We are in the process of working out how we might begin to open safely for other year groups as set out by the government. This is important and complicated work and will take time. We do not want to delay a return to school for longer than is absolutely necessary however only once we know how this can be achieved, will we be in a position to consider when this will occur. We want to make sure we have safe plans in place before asking you about returning your children to school, should you wish to do so.

Further government guidance was released last night and we are expecting more in the coming days. We are working together with the Local Authority to formulate a plan to get pupils and staff back safely. We will communicate this with you as soon as we are able to. For now, we remain closed other than to those who are accessing key worker provision.

Thank you for your support, patience and understanding at this time.

Family Support

We have a number of books in school to support families who have suffered a loss and are also awaiting a delivery of books to support children with worries and anxiety. If you'd like to borrow one of these, please get in touch.



Free school meal vouchers have been set up to be delivered to eligible families each week (£15 per child per week). If you believe you should be receiving these but haven't, or are having any problems with them, please contact the admin email address.

If you are in receipt of Child Tax Credit, with no Working Tax Credit (income below £16,190), Income Support, Income Based Jobseekers Allowance, Income Based Employment and Support Allowance, Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit or fall under the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 you may be entitled to qualify for free school meals.

We would encourage anyone who is unsure whether they qualify to apply anyway.



We have always known Rosie is a brilliant artist but she has really impressed us recently with her use of detail and shading. Keep them coming Rosie - We love your creativity!




