We are so proud of all of our children. Our new starters in Nursery and Reception have settled in beautifully and children in Key Stage 1 and 2 have made a fantastic start the school year!

Following feedback from our children and families regarding availbility of choices at lunchtime, we are trialling a new ordering system in school. Children will make their meal selection in class after registration and the chef will cook to order to avoid disappointment. Staff have been talking with children about meal choices each day and sharing a photo menu with children to help them choose. For children choosing sandwiches, they do also get the potato and vegetables on offer that day as well as being able to choose from a variety of items on the salad bar. We will be monitoring this closely over the next few weeks.

Katie the crossing patrol warden is back! A huge, huge thank you to all parents who dug deep to once again raise the cost of the patrol and keep her on the corner for the 2023/24 academic year.

New parents may not know that the lollipop costs £5,000 per academic year - and it is the sole responsibility of parents and our local community to pay for it since Newcastle City Council cut funding in 2017.

Only wardens on dual carriageways in the city were kept ie the Great North Road position (when filled).

We are known as the Parklands Community Crossing and over the last seven years, we have successfully raised a mammoth £35,000 and remain the only school crossing in Newcastle to have been saved every year since they were axed. This is something you should all feel immensely proud of. The fundraising is coordinated by just two mums, myself and Keri Walker. It is a big responsibility for just two people. Having done seven years of fundraising we both really feel we have 'done our bit' now and so would really welcome new parents to get involved and hit the target for 2024/25. 
They aim to act as "the voice" of Newcastle's parents and carers of children and young people with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND).

It has been a very busy week in wraparound. It is lovely to see so many new faces. We are busy recruiting; however, we do need advance notice of bookings and cannot accept children who have not been booked. Bookings must be made during the booking window which opens on the 10th of each month and closes on the 20th of each month, for the following month.

Unfortunately, we have had to turn away some families who have missed the booking deadline. Parents must make their own bookings on the school cloud system. The only exception to this is families using vouchers. If you are emailing dates for voucher bookings, you must include

- Your child's name
- The day and date
- The sessions required (breakfast, until 5pm, until 6pm).

School Dinner Money (KS2) for the term when remains at £2.20 per day, £11.00 for the week or if you wish to pay by the term it is eight weeks and £88.00.

If your child had packed lunches last year and is new to having school lunches, please let the office know.

We ask for a week's notice if anyone wants to change from packed lunch to school meals or vice versa so that the kitchen staff can order appropriately.

Free School Meals

Every child in Reception Year 1 and Year 2 is entitled to a free school meal but did you know...

Your child and their school may be able to get extra help, if you get one of the qualifying benefits.

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

Free School Meals cont...

 Universal Credit - if you apply after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

We encourage all parents to apply for Free School Meals during their Reception Year, so Newcastle City Council can assess whether your child and their school can receive this extra help. This can help to pay towards the cost of trips and clubs for your child. If you are successful in your application we will provide you with a free school jumper or cardigan.

If you are eligible for free school meals, vouchers are issued during holiday times for the supermarket of your choice!

Newcastle City Council operates an Apply Once process for Free School Meals. During your child's academic life you will only ever have to apply once for Free School Meals while they attend a Newcastle school.

If your application is refused, they will continue to check your details on a weekly basis, unless you tell them to stop. This means we will know if you start to get a qualifying benefit. They will approve your child's free school meals application and contact you.

If you apply through the online portal, you will receive an immediate response to your application. School will be informed of your child's Free School Meal application on a weekly basis.

We have lots of reminders for this week's newsletter as we settle back into routines after the summer break.

Drinks and Playtime Snacks

Wow! What a fantastic, summery first week back. It's given us a good reminder that we all need our named water bottles (no Air Up bottles) in school to keep us hydrated. Another reminder about playtime snacks: Children up to year 2 are offered a free fruit or vegetable snack daily at morning break or you may wish to provide your child with their own preferred fruit or vegetable choice. Key Stage 2 children are also permitted to bring in their own fruit or vegetable snack. Please remember that any form of packaged biscuit bar or snack such as cheese biscuit dippers etc. do not constitute as a fruit or veg snack and so should not be brought in to school for morning break. There is a wealth of fruit and vegetable choice out there that you can choose from, and children are able to bring in small pots of pre-prepared fruit or veg too. Mrs Wells

Bikes and Scooters

It's been lovely to see so many bikes and scooters in the racks this week. Please remember to dismount any bikes or scooters at the main gate and walk them on to the school site to avoid any bumps with pedestrians (adults too please). Please make sure bikes and scooters are parked up by 9am when the school gates will be locked.

Before and After School

If children are enjoying playing in the school grounds before and after school, please make sure they are supervised, particularly on the trim trail. School gates are locked at 9am until the end of the school day and are then locked again at 3:40pm.

Please make sure you leave the playground by 3:40 so we can lock the gates ready for Wraparound and other school clubs taking place on site.

Parking

Parking at the front of school and in the surrounding streets has greatly improved recently

Birthday Treats

There is absolutely no expectation for you to provide your child's class with birthday treats. Your child's birthday will celebrated with a song in class.

If you really want send in treats, these have to be nut free, individually wrapped and vegetarian friendly. These will not be eaten in class but will be sent home with children at the end of the day.

Please remember we are a nut free school. We have children in school with severe nut allergies. Do not send your child with any nut products in their snack or packed lunches such as cereal bars containing nuts or nut based chocolate spreads such as Nutella.



Please remember to put your mobile phone in your pocket/bag once on site unless it is an emergency.
