What is Numicon:

Numicon is a multi-sensory approach to teaching maths developed by experts in the classroom. It is designed to help children understand connections between numbers.

Through the multi-sensory activities and mathematical language of Numicon, children develop the understanding and skills that underpin their understanding of number.


Well done to Evie McBain who has achieved her Gymnastics Proficiency Award 8.
