Family Support

We have a number of books in school to support families who have suffered a loss and a selection of books to support children with worries and anxiety. If you'd like to borrow one of these, please get in touch.



We have been asked by the government not to provide free school meal vouchers to cover the half term period. For families who are eligible, I have requested next term's voucher to be paid in one instalment to cover the 7 week term. Families should be receiving a voucher next week or the week after for the value of £105. For families with two children, they will receive one voucher for the value of £210.

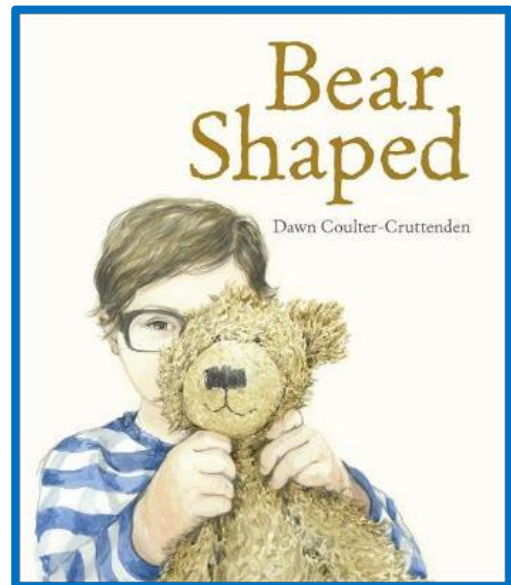
This is funded by central government. Please do activate your voucher, you are entitled to this support.

If you are in receipt of Child Tax Credit, with no Working Tax Credit (income below £16,190), Income Support, Income Based Jobseekers Allowance, Income Based Employment and Support Allowance, Guaranteed Element of State Pension Credit or fall under the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999 you may be entitled to qualify for free school meals.

We would encourage anyone who is unsure whether they qualify to apply anyway.

You can include – a brief summary of what the book is about, your favourite picture and why – your favourite part and why and would you recommend it to a friend? You could also tell us about your favourite bear.

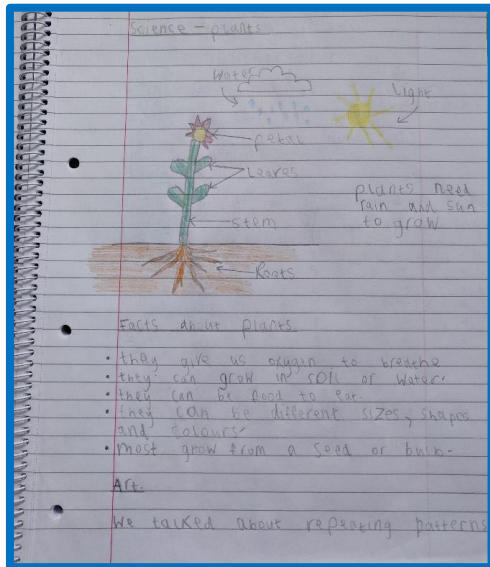
