PLEASE HELP SAVE OUR LOLLIPOP LADY

Thank you to everyone who has donated so far to safeguard the lollipop warden on the corner of Granville Road/Broadway East for next academic year.

At the time of writing, 76 people have donated £1,810. So we are currently £1,190 short of our £3,000 target.

Funding this crucial role has been the sole responsibility of our community since Newcastle City Council cut the funding for it five years ago. And we are just two Mums trying to make it happen, on behalf of all our kids. But we cannot do this without more support.

It costs £5,000 per year to keep a crossing patrol warden on the blind bend. But thanks to grants and other funding, we have been able to reduce what we need to find this year to £3,000.

We are asking that every family please help us, whether you use the crossing yourself or not. No donation is too small.

If we hit the target, we will be able to keep Katie helping the children across for a sixth year!

As ever, the choice is ours.

If we do not hit the target, then there will be no crossing patrol warden in post from September. All monies donated will be given back to benefit the children via the three PTFAs.

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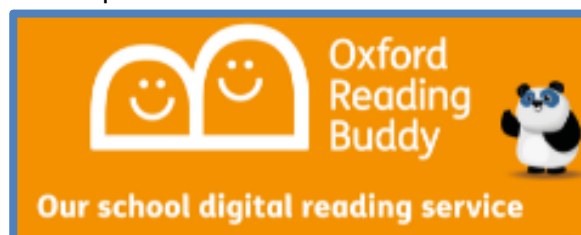
