# PARENT CONSULTATIONS RECEPTION TO YEAR 4

We look forward to seeing you all on your Parent Consultation evening either on Monday 9th October or Wednesday 11th October. Please check your child's reading folder as I have sent some invites out in an envelope to parents asking to meet with you; please don't worry this is not a negative thing, it is to catch up with you about some aspects of your child's life at GPFS. Please remember the consultations are for you and not for the children and are for **<u>10 minutes only</u>**. There will be some seats outside of the classroom where you will be able to sit and wait for your turn. On the evening, your will receive some information, tips to support your child with literacy and maths work. There will also be a Parent/School partnership-agreement form which we request you sign. Class teachers and children will have signed their agreements; this is to reflect how we all work together for the children e.g. in partnership.

Mrs Lamb DHT, will be based in the ICT suite to help parents with accessing Mathletics, PurpleMash and Maths of the Day. The ICT suite is situated near Violet class (up the first staircase turn left =ICT suite).

Yellow class parents- Ms Young will be joining Mrs Howitt at the Parent Consultations so that she can meet all of you. Ms Young has been in school undertaking hand over work with Mrs Howitt and working with the children.

## Head Lice Alert

We have had two cases of head lice in school and have been informed by children's parents. Please can people be vigilant and check their child's hair regularly. There are products available at supermarkets and chemists. If in doubt, Google National Head Lice Advice. Contrary to rumour only two cases have been reported. In no case does this signify neglect. Head lice like clean hair!

## Leave of Absence -Urgent Reminder

I am obliged to notify you that from September 2013 the Government Regulations came into effect with regards to holidays in term time. No holidays are permitted during the school term. Head Teachers can only grant leave in exceptional circumstances. Unauthorised absence can result in Local Authority fines and prosecution as directed by Central Government. The Government does not view holidays as exceptional circumstances. Please come to see me if you have any major difficulties and wish to discuss matters with me or put it in writing. Leave can only be granted in exceptional circumstances, if leave is taken without permission then your child/ren will have an unauthorised code on their school attendance record. All attendance is tracked by the Local Authority Data Team and each school in the City and schools across the country are monitored. We are doing so well with our attendance and Mrs Lamb my DHT keeps you informed on a weekly basis with the statistics. Thank you for your attention and cooperation with this matter it is appreciated.

#### TRAINEES IN SCHOOL

Every term we host trainees from Northumbria University who are training to be teachers in school. They work alongside class teachers and are a great support for the children in supporting them with their learning. In EYRs we will be hosting trainees from Newcastle College who are undertaking Early Childhood Studies and this also provides our children with additional adult support.

# Urgent - SECURITY & SAFETY 3rd Notification

1. When collecting your child at the end of the day KS1 and KS2, your child's class teacher will bring the class to the exit door. We request that you collect your child from the class teacher. Any children who have not been collected by 3:35 are brought down to the school office to be collected from there. All the children and staff know that children must only go to the adult who usually collects them unless we have been informed otherwise.

2. **Outside gates** – <u>we need your help</u>. Please ensure that they are closed. There are signs on the gates. Your support with this is much appreciated.

3. End of school day – we request that at the end of the day parents, carers etc. don't open the gates and come on site until 3.20pm Staff could be teaching PE/Games lessons outside. This ensures that we don't have people wandering around the site when our children are outside. 4. Internal door outside school office – are controlled electronically. Please note that you won't just be able to go down the corridor. You must see Admin staff first.

 5. Please do not allow your children to climb or swing on the <u>Early Years red railings</u>. Keep children behind the white line and do not allow them to climb the ramp or steps. This also applies to the <u>railings outside the School Office</u>
6. Children and adults must not ride their bikes or scooters once you have entered the school gates. This can result in people being knocked over. It has happened.

7. Please ensure that children do not come onto the school site without a key adult who must stay with them until the children have come into school at 8:55 am.

**Can I please remind parents that bikes and scooters are left on our site at your own risk**. Please ensure that your child's bike or scooter is named as some children have the same models. Thanking you in advance for your support.

## Medical Alert Assistance Dog (MAAD) Cooper (as already advised)

You will all have seen Cooper the dog on the site, he lives with one of our families. He supports one of our darlings in school who is diabetic. Cooper wears a red coat which identifies him as a 'MAAD' dog. He comes onto the school site on a daily basis with the family. At the special assembly which Bridget from the (MADD association) undertook a few weeks ago, she told the children all about Cooper's role and the 'dos & don'ts' when he comes onto the site with his owner. He will not be in school, only on the site at drop off and pick up times. You will be aware of other Medical Assistance dogs e.g. for visually and hearing impaired people who need support. Bridget has sent in some Assistance Dogs UK entrance door stickers to indicate that Assistance Dogs are welcome on our school site. ## ABSENCE/MEDICINES ETC + SCHOOL ABSENCE LINE NURSERY TO YEAR 4

You are required to contact School on the first day of your child's absence and state the reason for the absence. Please keep the School Office informed of any prolonged illness. If your child has sickness and diarrhoea they must be kept off school for 48 hours from the last 'bout'. This is a requirement due to the spread of contagious viruses etc. and to protect everyone in school – this instruction is from Public Health. We have already had four staff off with the 'bug'.

If your child has to have an urgent visit to the GP or a hospital appointment you are required to come to the school office and get a pass. The only person in school who can authorise an absence is the Head Teacher and NOT the Class Teacher. I have given permission to Mrs Eltringham /Mrs Douglas to issue passes for medical appointments. If it is a hospital appointment a copy of the letter would be helpful to have so that we can help with any health needs or requirements.

Please contact school if your child has developed any allergies; now requires an inhaler due to diagnosis of Asthma or requires prescribed medication. Mrs Wilson will continue to meet with parents who have stated that their child has asthma to discuss a Health Care Plan re inhaler use etc.

Could we appeal to all parents to make sure that we can contact them (or another appropriate adult) by phone, should their child be ill or in case of any other emergency. Harvest Festival

I had a lovely chat with the technical team this morning who were very helpful! They understand that some users have been having issues with flash. Here is their advice...

When logging onto a computer or laptop we recommend using the web browser Google Chrome and following the steps below:

- Copy and paste the following into your search browser: chrome://settings/content

- Select Flash
- Ensure that the 'Allow sites to run Flash' is turned on and 'Ask First' is turned off

Alternatively, if you wish to use a different browser, please click the link below to find out how to enable Flash on your browser.

- For Internet Explorer, see Enable Flash Player for Internet Explorer.
- For Internet Explorer on Windows 10, see Enable Flash Player for IE on Windows 10.
- For Firefox on any OS, see <u>Enable Flash Player</u> for Firefox.
- For Safari on Mac OS, <u>see Enable Flash Player</u> for Safari.
- For Google Chrome, see <u>Enable Flash Player for</u> <u>Chrome</u>.
- For Opera, see Enable Flash Player for Opera.

When logging in on the iPad, you are able to access the new Mathletics student console via the browser on the device rather than using the APP.
