### **Chores for Change**

Our next fundraising event will be an in-school event and will run from Tuesday 25<sup>th</sup> February until Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> April. The idea is for each class to compete to win a fabulous prize by each completing small jobs/chores at home in exchange for change which the children then bring into school to add to their individual class money jugs. Each week the jugs will be emptied, and the class totals recorded on a poster in school. We hope this will be a fun and engaging way for the children to contribute to the fundraising for school and help everyone with a bit of spring cleaning (see letter below).

We will also be donating 20% of the total amount raised to a charity very dear to one of our families. Medical Detection Dogs helped to train Cooper, who belongs to Rosie Dalkin. Rosie has diabetes, and Cooper is her Medical Detection Dog. The charity will be coming into school on Monday 24<sup>th</sup> February to do an assembly with the children to talk about how important dogs like Cooper are to people like Rosie.

The Friends of GPFS fundraising effort this term will be class based rather than an event.

Chores for Change: The Money Jug Challenge

#### Tuesday 25th February – Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> April 2020

#### <u>The Challenge</u>

- The aim is for each class to fill a 6pt Milk bottle (which will be in each class) with coins of any denomination (but please ensure you only donate British sterling, we are unable to bank any foreign coins) and see which class can raise the most money in this half term.
- We want the children to *earn* the money they bring in. The idea is for the children to volunteer to do chores or little jobs for friends and family in exchange for their change. It could be something as simple as helping with the shopping, helping put away laundry or maybe washing the car! Then they bring in their earnings to pop in their class bottle.
- Every Friday Morning the bottles will be emptied, the total amount will be counted, and the empty bottle returned to class. The amount raised will be recorded on a poster in school so each class can see how they are doing in comparison to the rest of the school. At the end of the half term, the class that raises the most money will be rewarded with a Non School Uniform Day and a movie with snacks and drinks provided by the PTFA (date TBC by winning class teacher).
- We would like the children to use the record booklet to note down what they have done to raise money. We think it would be a lovely way for the children to see how they have contributed to helping school. Record booklets will be sent home after half term.



We will be donating 20% of the total amount raised to the Medical Detection Dogs (www.medicaldetectiondogs.org.uk), who have trained Cooper, Rosie's (Y4) support dog. You may recall reading about Rosie and Cooper in Mrs Lamb's newsletter on 6<sup>th</sup> December or maybe you have met Cooper as he is often on the school run. Cooper is a very important part of Rosie's life and a member of our extended community, which is why we have chosen to support this charity. On Monday 24<sup>th</sup> February a volunteer from Medical Detection Dogs is coming into school to do an assembly with the children to discuss how important these dogs are to the lives of so many people, like Rosie. Cooper and his human, Jen, will also be attending the assembly.

We hope that this challenge will encourage our wonderful pupils to use their entrepreneurial skills to think of ways to earn money, be helpful and thoughtful in their community, understand the value of money and feel proud to support their school. We hope the competition between the classes will encourage the children to work as a team, support each other and most of all, be fun!
