- Always supervise children using sparklers.
- Give them gloves to wear when holding sparklers
- Avoid dressing children in loose or flowing clothes as they may catch alight
- Show children how to hold sparklers - away from their body and at arm's length.
- Teach children not to wave sparklers near anyone else or run while holding them

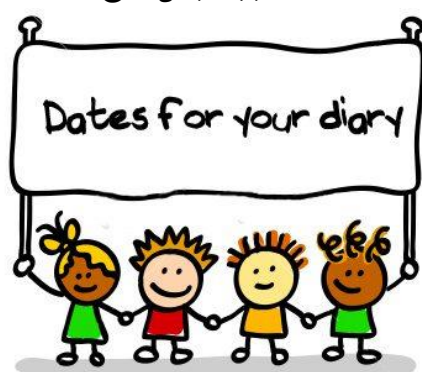
