



## Plans for September

We are delighted that the latest guidance from the DfE (Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> June) supports a full time return to school for all pupils from September. Children will still be in bubbles but these can be much larger than before. There will be measures in place to reduce contact across bubbles but we will have some flexibility to make our arrangements practical. This is welcome news for us as we will be able to create year group bubbles, not just class bubbles, for play and some learning activities. We are also going to be able to continue to employ supply teachers if necessary and specialist teachers such as sports coaches, music and language teachers. Visitors to the site will be limited as much as possible and there won't be large whole school events to begin with. There will be a staggered start and finish to the school day but the children will still have the same amount of teaching time each day. We will be working in the summer to formulate plans which we will share with you as soon as we are able to. Given the number of changes to all of the previous guidance, we anticipate some adjustments before September.

We are looking forward to September, seeing all of our children return and reuniting our GPFS family.

Lucy has been busy making books showcasing all of the brilliant Oak Academy work that she has done over the last few months! What a fantastic idea Lucy.

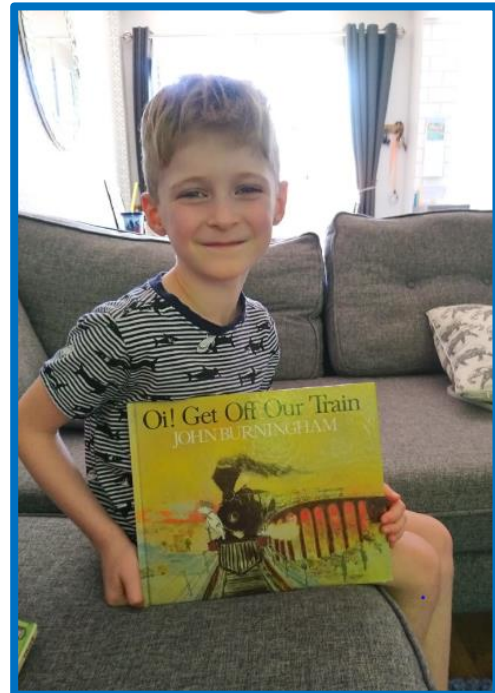


William has been busy and worked hard doing some artwork. What fantastic pieces of art, I particularly like the giraffe.



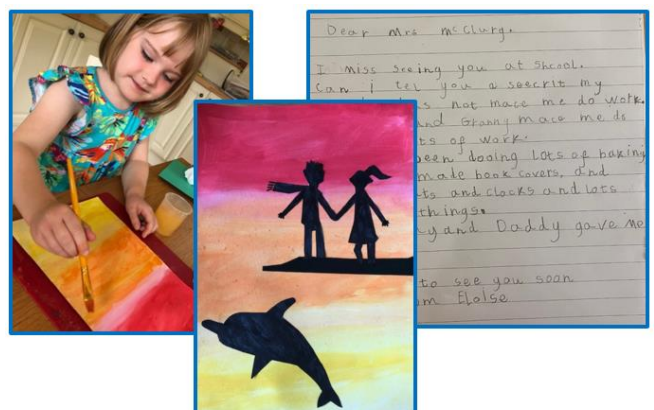

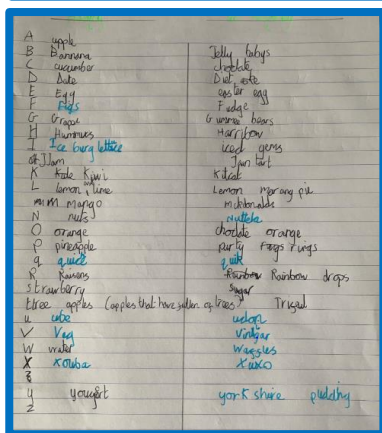
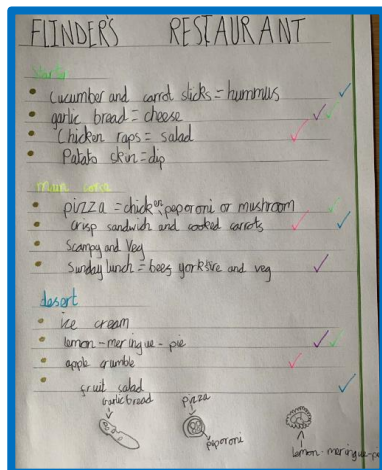
Ayla had lots of fun picking strawberries to make her own jam. Yum, strawberry jam is my favourite!
