Urgent Help Needed – Children's Health

If your child has developed any health issues that we need to know about please contact the School Office asap to update your child's health record. This includes diagnosed allergies; asthma; convulsions hearing; vision; toileting needs, kidney, bowel problems; stomach disorders; headaches –migraine etc,etc.

If your child has a broken limb, severe sprain, you must contact school to arrange a meeting with me or Mrs Lamb so that we can put measures into place – risk assessment for the safety of your child.

Medications can only be administered if they are prescribed. We cannot give over the counter bought medications. This is under the directives of the Health Authority. If medication needs to be kept at a certain temperature we do not have a medical fridge for this; advice is to bring it in a small cool pouch with an ice pack.

I have given permission to my admin staff to issue passes for children who have to attend hospital appointments; we are required by the Local Authority Attendance team to ask to see the hospital appointment letter or card. Our children are very important and we endeavour to help as much as we can. Thank you for your cooperation with this.
