








Please remember to send named water bottles to school each day.

- 1. Go to www.childrenscancerrun.co.uk
- 2. Click Enter Now under the Run for My School option
- 3. You will be asked to Sign Up to Everyday Hero in order to register this is a very quick and easy step. The easiest option is to do this through the email option.
- 4. Once you are signed in, choose individual or family entry making sure that you select our school from the drop down list
- 5. Complete the details for each member of you family and then click proceed to payment to complete the registration

Please note that the three and five mile courses are suitable for children Over 7. All children must be accompanied by an adult (parents can accompany their children on the Mini Mile without registering but please register if you would like to receive a t-shirt, medal and picnic).

All participants receive a t-shirt, medal and Gregg's picnic on the day. Metro radio will also be there to entertain everyone with music and competitions.

We would encourage you to do what you can in order to raise sponsorship as all of the funds raised will be used to fund the research team at Newcastle who are working to find better treatments and cures for childhood cancer.
