PARENT CONSULTATIONS REPLIES

RECEPTION TO YEAR 4

The deadline for returning the reply slip to your child's teacher was Thursday 28th September. As advised if you didn't return the reply slip by the deadline date then you would be allocated a time. Thank you to those of you who have returned the replies so promptly. You will receive the time frame slip back with your appointment time on it, on Tuesday 3rd October. Please check your child's reading folder on Tuesday. I will also be sending out a letter to see parents but if any parent or carer wishes to meet with me then please contact the School Office team and I will arrange to see you. Mrs Lamb will be based in the ICT suite if any parents would like to pop in for support with Mathletics, PurpleMash or any other queries. We look forward to seeing you all on your Parent Consultation evening. Please remember this is for you and not for the children. On the evening, you will receive some information, tips to support your child with literacy, maths and IT work. There will also be a Parent/School partnership-agreement form which we request you sign, class teachers and children will have signed their agreements; this is to reflect how we all work together for the children e.g. in partnership.

TRAINEES IN SCHOOL

Every term we host trainees from Northumbria University who are training to be teachers in school. They work alongside class teachers and are a great support for the children in supporting them with their learning. In EYRs we will be hosting trainees from Newcastle College who are undertaking Early Childhood Studies and this also provides our children with additional adult support.

Urgent reminder - Clothing & Water bottles etc.

Despite this information being put in last week's newsletter we still have major issues with unnamed items of clothing including shoes, packed lunch boxes and water bottles.

Children can get distressed when they lose their belongings and as you would expect, it so difficult to support children when clothing etc. is not named. I have a fantastic group of children who help match items of lost clothing and property to children. Our frustration is when things are not named. We will have to hold a second hand clothes sale soon as the lost property box is bulging. A plea to parents and carers who are not cooperating with this request - act now.

I would like to give grateful thanks to the many parents and carers who name EVERYTHING, you are marvellous.

So – Please; ensure that ALL clothing including shoes are named. We appear to have started the new term and new school year with a mountain of un-named clothing and shoes etc. in our lost property box!

Children need to bring in a named filled water bottle each day and take it home on a daily basis. The bottles are for water only and NOT juice as advised from School Health. Your support with this is needed.

If you would like to volunteer to come in and help in school we would welcome this. However you must be DBS cleared (Disclosure and Barring Service). GOLD STAR AWARDS -RECEPTION TO YEAR 4

At the children's request we will continue with the Gold Star Award scheme from Reception to YR4. For every ten Gold Stars the children collect they will receive a certificate and a small prize. The Gold Star collection cards are also used as a counting tool for +/x etc. maths work. We have a display in the entrance area near the School Office, a fabulous rainbow and pot of gold. When a child gets their first 10 Stars, their picture is put up on the display and moved to different sections as they collect the next sets of 10. The children hope that they will get to 100. At the moment we have a range from 10-80. The 100 mark total will be a shooting star, if we get there. Over the year the children will receive Gold Stars for exceptional things e.g. they have gone beyond the call of duty to help others, have shown real determination and effort with tricky aspects of work etc. The Gold Stars are not awarded for being polite and helpful etc. as this is what everyone should be doing. Thank you to all of our children who are working very hard to get their stars.

Jay: Its really fun learning about those hard words when lots of us have not been to Spain – it feels like we have!


Evie: I've really been enjoying Spanish. It's been really fun, the work has been really interesting and I have learned a lot!
