School Clubs YR2s & KS2

Children in YR2, YR3 and YR4 will have brought home a club letter inviting them to make a 1st, 2nd, 3rd choice of a club they wish to join (YR2s have two choices). The clubs are run by school staff. The deadline to return the reply slips is Wednesday 18th October. Your child will be notified as to which club they have been allocated by Friday 20th October. 
