## Illness

Illness - We really appreciate that children want to come to school when they are ill because they love school. Unfortunately, this is not helping to contain the number of bugs and viruses which are doing the rounds in Nursery and Main School. As a staff we commend parents for doing the right thing and trying to keep their child's attendance at an acceptable level but if children are not at all well they shouldn't be in school. If you are not sure please contact the School Office who will seek advice and get back to you.

## First Aid

First Aid – All of our Support Staff are qualified First Aiders. We have three members of support staff who have the enhanced qualification and can deal with more complicated situations. The staff are Mrs Wilson, Mrs Hall and Mrs Tudor. If your child has hurt themselves or had an accident this is dealt with by our First Aiders and a form given to inform you of treatment etc. If they have a bumped head, then a bumped head sticker will be given as well. However, parents are called in depending on the individual child's need. We encourage the children to let us know if they have hurt themselves, bumped into someone etc. so that the situation can be dealt with immediately. We do remind them about this. All Staff are as vigilant as they can be. First aid bags are used outside at playtimes/lunchtimes by support staff. Anything else which requires more assistance then the child/ren are brought into school.

# Parent Consultations

## Parking around School PLEASE READ

For some time now we have been reminding parents to park considerately and safely around school at drop off and pick up times each day. We have no control over the parking, or any matter off our school site, however, I would hope that parents and carers would take notice of what we have to say and trust that we would only repeat this message because we have genuine concern for the safety of the children and their families.

We are still hearing reports of people parking on the zig zag lines, parking where there is no parking bay, parking in the disabled bay, parking across residents' drives and so on. We have also been informed that when cars are parked on the bridal path/road to the Golf Club, emergency vehicles cannot gain access to houses and the club. This is a private road and is for access only, please refrain from parking there.

The benefits of cycling, walking and scooting to school are many and I would urge you to do so if you are able to. If you do need to use the car, then you could consider parking at the Three Mile or Asda and walking for the remainder of the journey.

Given the recent concerns over pollution and the danger to children especially, if you are using your car, please turn off your engine as soon as your car is stationary. As well as posing a threat to health, it is an offence to have your engine running unnecessarily while your vehicle is stationary on a public road.

Northumbria Police have told us that we should urge you to contact them on 101 if you see anyone driving/parking illegally. I hope that you will all support us in improving safety for our children and everyone in our school community.
