In September, Gosforth Park First School will be starting our first new topic: Gosforth is Great!

This geography-based topic will teach our children about their own locality through fieldwork, maps, aerial photographs and much more. From a historical perspective, we will also be looking at some of the changes that have occurred within our locality from within and beyond living memory.

For your child's holiday homework, we would like them to research an aspect of Gosforth's geography or history so that they can present their findings to their new class or join in a class discussion about what they already know.

- Design a brochure about things to do in Gosforth
- Draw a map of your area
- Make a PowerPoint presentation about an aspect of Gosforth that you have researched
- Research famous people from Gosforth

Our events earn us large chunks of money which is, as you can see, put to very good use. Unfortunately, the number of volunteers has not been as high as we had hoped for at our last couple of events. We cannot stress enough that, **in order for these events to go ahead we need more people to spare a little of their time to help us**. The Committee members are all very dedicated and help at all of the events, as well as doing the necessary prep and planning work too. The events and fundraising are only possible with the continued support of all our families in the GPFS community.

Match Funding

We wanted to take this opportunity to remind you about the Match Funding scheme and how a little bit of your time could raise double the funds for the PTA.

If you work for an organisation that has a match funding policy, any money you raise could be matched by your employer. Companies may match the fundraising total for an event, or for the stall that their employee is working on. Usually, the employee will need to supply them with a letter from the PTA detailing the date and nature of the event, together with the total raised.

We understand that the high street banks, building societies, supermarkets and large corporations are likely to do match funding, but these schemes are not exclusive to the major corporate giants. If you work for an independent company, they may be interested in charitable giving through match funding too.

We would be grateful if you could see if your employer has a match funding scheme, or if they are willing to match fund any of our events. If you can't help out this time, but you know the company you work for has a match funding policy, please let us know. This could be a really large source of income for the PTA and help us raise money for The Friends of Gosforth Park First School.

If you are able to help us this way, please let one of the committee members or the school office know and we can discuss your companies' requirements.

Thank you to everyone who has helped us this academic year. Whether it be volunteering, donating a prize or cake or just supporting us by turning up at an event. We really do work hard to ensure we make the events as fun and exciting for the children, and hope you have all enjoyed attending.
