### An open letter from Parklands Community Crossing....

Dear Parents, Guardians and Supporters,

It's that time again, doesn't it come around quickly? It's the time when we ask our local community to once again help us to keep our children safe for another year.

For those new to our school community, the crossing patrol warden you see on the corner of Broadway East/Granville Road is NOT paid for by Newcastle City Council. It is paid for by us.

Since 2017, our community has fund raised the £5,000 needed each year to keep a lollipop on that dangerous blind bend.

This is probably our hardest year. We know that times are incredibly tough for lots of people, and for small businesses. We also have fewer pupils using the crossing since the relocation of Broadway East.

But, as always, if we do not pay Newcastle City Council then there will be no crossing patrol warden on the corner from September 2023.

Thankfully due to more grant funding we have secured, the amount left to raise by September is very achievable.

Whilst we really do not want to ask parents hit financially by the current cost of living crisis for money, we have no choice but to ask those who are able to dig deep and donate, via justgiving crowd funding.

Rightly or wrongly, it remains the sole responsibility of Gosforth East Middle, St. Oswald's RC Primary, and Gosforth Park First school communities to keep our children crossing the corner to school safely.

If you are able, we are asking every family in our school community (whether your own child uses the crossing or not) to donate whatever you can afford, and allow us to save the crossing for the 7th year in a row.

We need EVERY family who can to get behind us to donate. Every single penny helps.

Thanks in advance for making ours the only school crossing patrol saved by its community every year since the City Council first axed their funding in 2017.

## Top Tips from the Police

We had a lovely visit from our local PCSOs this week who popped in to see us. They have recommended that families make sure they make a note of any bicycle frame numbers so in the event of any cycle thefts, property can be returned to it's rightful owners.

Most bicycles have a frame number stamped into the metal under the bottom bracket. If it's a carbon frame, the number will be etched into the surface or displayed on a sticker. Occasionally, the frame number will be on the inside of the chain stay or on the down tube or top tube. See the diagram below if you need to identify these areas of the bicycle.

Our whole school attendance to date this academic year is **96.2%** which is above this time last year (94.7%)


Our classes of the week this week are **Reception SC** with **96.9%** attendance and **Orange Class** with **96.7%** attendance.
