Proposed Expansion

Dear Parents

We were delighted to share our consultation on the proposed expansion and refurbishment of GPFS with you earlier this week. We are so excited about the opportunities this will provide for our children in terms of space and facilities for learning.

A few frequently asked questions we've had so far...

Will the school take in 60 pupils in each year group straight away?

No — we plan to first admit 15 extra pupils in Reception and this cohort of 60 will then move through school. We then plan to admit 15 additional pupils in each following Reception year group. It would take 5 years before we were a 2 form entry school from Reception to Year 4.

Will there be lots of extra classes and teachers?

No, we plan to only have one extra Key Stage One class with one extra teacher in the second year of expansion and then eventually one extra Key Stage Two class with one extra teacher.

When will your reception intake be increased to 60?

The published admission number (PAN) for the school wouldn't increase to 60 until September 2023 as we need to complete the statutory School Organisation process for enlargement of the school premises prior to this being implemented.

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However, the governing body can agree to admit over the PAN to 60 places in total in September 2022 if the places are needed to meet local need and not adversely affect other neighbouring Gosforth schools. The closing date for on-time reception applications for September 2022 was only last week, so this will be confirmed once the Local Authority has all the relevant information, including the applications from neighbouring local authorities, and has analysed it. This will happen prior to primary National Offer Day on 15 April and we will provide an update once this is confirmed.

Covid-19 Update

Today I spoke with Public Health regarding the increase in cases affecting both pupils and staff in school this week. PHE have asked us to continue with our current measures in school and to remind parents of the following

 Remember to book a PCR test if you or your child are experiencing any symptoms, no matter how mild, including any respiratory symptoms such as the onset of a cold or any severe or prolonged headaches.

We also know that many of our children who have returned positive results have had an upset tummy.

- Lateral Flow Tests are for asymptomatic testing only. They should not be relied upon if your child is displaying any symptoms, no matter how mild.
- Children and staff can only return on day 6
 if they have returned a negative LFT on day
 5 and 6 and do not have a temperature


We will also be taking part in lots of fun maths activities in class and around school too.

Attendance

Whole school attendance so far this academic year is 94.8%.

Our Class of the week is Yellow Class with 97.8% attendance. Well done!

Covid-19 Update

We are continuing with our current Covid-19 protective measures which have been reviewed in consultation with Newcastle Public Health.

Although we know that with the new variant, symptoms are much milder, we have had an increase in cases this week and are keeping the following restrictions in place to limit transmission and disruption to learning in school.

- Staff will be wearing face coverings in corridors and communal areas, including on the doors when greeting children in the morning
- We will be limiting the mixing of children within school and therefore;
- ✓ Children will be separated into 'bubbles' on the playground
- ✓ Non-essential lunchtime and after school clubs will be paused
- ✓ Children will remain with their own classes for lessons and assemblies
- ✓ Assemblies will be virtual
- ✓ Children attending Rainbow Wraparound will be separated into 'bubbles' and spaced out in a large, well-ventilated area
- ✓ Children in KS1 and KS2 will be seated in forward facing rows
- ✓ Additional hand sanitising / hand washing for children throughout the school day


If your child is absent from school for COVID-19 related reasons, and they are well enough to work, we are setting work via Tapestry (EYFS) and Seesaw.

People who are self-isolating with COVID-19 have the option to reduce their isolation period after 5 full days if they test negative with an LFD test on both day 5 and day 6 and **they do not have a temperature**. For example, if they test negative on the morning of day 5 and the morning of day 6, they can return to their education or childcare setting immediately on day 6.

The first test must be taken no earlier than day 5 of the self-isolation period, and the second must be taken the following day. All test results should be reported to NHS Test and Trace.

If the result of either test is positive, they should continue to self-isolate until they get negative results from two LFD tests on consecutive days or until they have completed 10 full days of self-isolation, whichever is earliest.

Anyone who is unable to take LFD tests or anyone who continues to have a temperature will need to complete the full 10-day period of self-isolation.
