- 7 Under the direction of the Breakfast Club/After School Club/Holiday Club Leader. Assist in the control of income and expenditure for the Breakfast/After School Club ensuring relevant records are maintained.

- Assist in maintaining a healthy, safe and secure environment and act in accordance with the School's policies and procedures.
- To promote and implement the Council's Equality Policy in all aspects of employment and service delivery.
- The postholder will have responsibility for promoting and safeguarding the welfare of children and young persons s/he is responsible for, or comes into contact with as a named Designated Safeguarding Lead.
