





HEAD LICE HAVE BEEN REPORTED IN SCHOOL

Please check your child's hair tonight.

To help prevent your child catching headlice and to ensure prompt detection we advise you to look particularly closely at your child's hair each week. Brushing and combing hair thoroughly every day can be effective preventative measures. Headlice can infest anyone, regardless of length of hair or standard of personal hygiene.

The eggs of the louse are often more easily detected than the insect itself. They look like shiny, grey/white oval specks stuck to the hair close to the scalp and cannot be easily brushed off like dandruff. They tend to be laid at the nape of the neck, behind the ears or on top of the head. It is advisable that all members of the family are inspected and that friends and the school are informed if head lice are found.

If lice or eggs (nits) are found they can be treated in two ways: you can either buy a preparation from the chemist; or wash the hair and apply conditioner and comb through thoroughly – this must be repeated every 3-4 days for two weeks.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

While Bluesky has been around since 2019, it's suddenly taken off in a big way thanks to a significant exodus from X (formerly Twitter). Indeed, it looks and behaves a lot like Twitter before Elon Musk bought the platform. Bluesky has been touted in recent months as a safer, more open-minded alternative to X - but like any social media site, it still has its share of risks.

NO PRIVATE ACCOUNTS

While most social networks allow Accounts to be private, at the time of writing, all Bluesky accounts must be public. The development team has indicated bis might change in the future, but the app is built on a public-first protocol. If private accounts are ever introduced, it may only be in a limited way – such as through the implementation of group chats.

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INTERACTIONS WITH STRANGERS

Every account being public means that anyone can be contacted by anyone else. While users don't have to respond and can asily block people and move on, it does mean that youngsters are at particular risk of being conned by scammers, messaged by predator adults or exposed to others with ill intentions. These hazards can be compounded by the fact that Bluesky doesn't require its users to provide their real name.

TROLLING AND BULLYING

While Bluesky currently feels a lot friendlier than X seems to have become, its lack of private X seems to have become, it's lack of private accounts means that there's nothing to stop users from trolling and cyberbullying younger people. While accounts can be blocked and reported, a persistent bully could simply create a new profile, potentially making their victims feel unsafe in continuing to use the app.

GE RESTRICTION

At the time of writing, Bluesky seems calm in comparison with other social networks where moderation is lax and the atmosphere toxic – but that's due at least in part to its smaller community. The app has recently been adding as many as a million users per day, and if that continues, there'll be more unpleasant users to handle, and moderators could struggle to maintain the pleasant environment Bluesky is currently known for.

USE THE ADULT CONTENT FILTER

ENCOURAGE BLOCKING AND REPORTING

Another tool that Bluesky uses to ensure a decent experience is muting and blocking accounts. The former prevents you from seeing a specific user's content, while the latter stops them from seeing yours. If a child is encountering trolls or bullies on the platform, encourage them to use this function, while also reporting the offenders to help make the platform a nicer place for everyone

KEEP AN OPEN DIALOGUE

As with all social media platforms, moderation and content filters can only do so much; it's highly likely that a child will eventually face something unsavoury. For that reason, it's important to make sure that young people are aware of the risks and know how to handle the technology if anything they see on the app makes them feel unsafe or uncomfortable



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
